

# Junior Leadership Columbia 2017-2018 Application

JUNIOR LEADERSHIP COLUMBIA (JLC) is an innovative community program designed by the Columbia Chamber of Commerce for high school juniors. The nine month program motivates emerging leaders and develops the potential for community leadership by acquainting participants with the opportunities, realities and challenges of the Columbia community.

What does it take to be a leader? Leaders possess various traits that make them who they are and they continuously develop those traits. Junior Leadership Columbia focuses on the following eight characteristic traits:

- Advocacy
- Ambition
- Commitment
- Courage
- Creativity
- Innovation
- Integrity
- Personal Responsibility

Each session will focus on one of these traits as it relates to the session topic. Sessions are organized by members of the community and experts from various organizations and institutions. Participants will have the opportunity to meet and learn from various community leaders throughout the program.

JLC is open to 25 from Columbia area public and private high schools who will be juniors in the 2017-2018 school year. Each completed application will be submitted anonymously for review by a selection committee. A select number of applicants will be asked to participate in an interview with members of the selection committee. After being interviewed, the final 25 students will be invited to participate in the 2017-2018 program. The selection committee will be looking for students who have demonstrated leadership in the past or have a strong interest in holding leadership roles in their communities, schools and/or vocations. The selection committee will strive to include participants from all segments of the community. These committee members reserve the right to accept or reject any applicant. It is the policy of the Columbia Chamber of Commerce to grant equal opportunity to all qualified persons without regard to race, color, gender, sexual orientation, handicap, sex, religion, creed, national origin, or ancestry.

Commitment is a trait that is key to leadership. Applicants must commit to participate in all JLC activities and all program sessions. We understand that students are active in other extracurricular activities which may cause a session absence. In order to graduate from JLC, a student cannot have more than two excused absences. JLC begins in August 2017 and concludes with a Graduation Banquet in April 2018. Sessions include:

- Eight Monday evening sessions from 5 7:30 p.m.
- •One Saturday service project
- •One morning at the March Chamber of Commerce
- Quarterly Membership Breakfast and Business Showcase
- •One full day field trip in Jefferson City

A non-refundable application fee of \$25 is to be paid by check made payable to the Columbia Chamber of Commerce. Please write the applicant's name in the memo line.
